

# **TONBRIDGE AND MALLING CRIME AND DISORDER REDUCTION PARTNERSHIP**

## **Action Plan 2005/6**

This Action Plan has been compiled in support of the Partnership's Crime and Disorder Strategy 2005-2008 and to ensure that individual projects contribute to the delivery of that Strategy.

Many of the projects featured in the Action Plan for 2004/5 have proven to be effective and are accordingly retained. Others are new and innovative and are enabled by Local Area Agreement Funding. These funds are the Safer and Stronger Communities Fund and the Police Area Commanders Basic Command Unit funds. Local funds provided by the Borough Council, Kent County Council and the Police are also utilised to support the actions.

This Action Plan is for one year only, as experience has demonstrated the need for flexibility to accommodate changes in crime trends and fashions, the Partnership must be able to react to these changes. The Borough has a relatively low level of crime and disorder but the Partnership is determined to further reduce crime.

As you read the Plan, you will see that all Partners are involved. The Plan is thematic, Crime and Disorder will be tackled without regard to whether it be classed as rural or urban. The intention is to cut crime throughout the Borough.

## Targets April 2005 – March 2008

The CDRP has carefully considered the setting of crime reduction targets for the period of the Strategy and has attempted to be realistic as to the level of reduction that can be achieved given the low levels of crime within the Borough. The Home Office has set a national crime reduction target for those offences identified by the public in a national survey as being of greatest concern (Comparator crimes). This target is 25% over the three year period 2005-2008. Each CDRP has discussed with the Home Office its contribution to this target. Those contributions are based upon the past success rating of individual CDRPs. The Tonbridge & Malling target is a 10% reduction. This is reflected in both the three and one year targets below.
